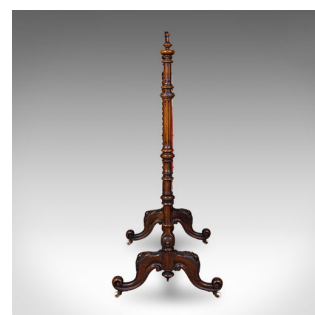


Antique Armorial Embroidered Panel Screen, Irish, Walnut, Needlepoint, Victorian

- The Fleur de lis upon the Cross Moline relates to Castle Dillon, County Armagh
- A branch of the historic English Molyneux family, their motto is Stat Fortuna Domus Virtute

• Embroidered below the crest, it translates to 'The fortune of our house endures through virtue'
