DESCRIPTION

This is an antique microscope. An English, brass jug handle scientific instrument by C. Baker of London, dating to the Edwardian period, circa 1910.

- Attractive and appealing scientific instrument
- Displays a desirable aged patina
- Lacquered brass in deep dark hues some wear commensurate with age and use
- \bullet Mahogany carry box shows rich russet hues and benefits from working lock key present
- Extendable eyepiece tube over a rack and pinion main focus with additional fine focus
 - Triple revolving nosepiece resides above a square stage with mechanical slide holder
- The three C. Baker objective lenses with supplied brass canisters resting within a mount
 - Bright plano-concave mirror beneath the slide holder
 - Polished brass trim beams against the dark lacquer of the main body
 - Distinctive form known as the 'jug handle' Baker microscope
 - Engraved for Charles Baker operated from 244 High Holborn, London
