This is an antique condiment serving set. An English, silver plated table rack by Philip Ashbury and Sons of Sheffield, dating to the Edwardian period, circa 1910.

- Attractive 5 piece condiments set for the dinner table
 - Displays a desirable aged patina with very light historical marks under close inspection, consistent with careful use
- Silver plate offers a bright, quality appearance
- Monogrammed shield to the front with ornate cursive initials for 'HH'
- 5 compartments for placement of each of the condiments vessels
- Each is resplendent in quality, diamond pattern glass with silver plated collars
- Salt and pepper shakers with delicate pierced lids
- Two spirit vessels with matching cut glass stoppers
- Condiment caddy with silver plated spoon, held in place by a pleasing hinged lid
- The spoon hallmarked with WP inside a diamond and L for London
- Hallmarks to base of rack read 'PA & SS' with serial number, for Philip Ashbury and Sons of Sheffield
