This is an antique display bookcase. An English, walnut, boxwood inlay and ormolu dressed Empire cabinet, dating to the Regency period, circa 1820.

- Attractive example of Regency period library furniture
- Displaying a desirable aged patina and in good order
- Select walnut stock show fine grain interest and rich caramel hues
- Presenting a quality wax polish finish and boxwood inlays
- Distinctive sarcophagus shaped top with band of ormolu detail above the apron
- Striking oval glazed doors dressed with ormolu trim to window frames and door edge
- Two shaped lock escutcheons with foliate engravings over inset locks – key absent
- The interior arranged as a pair of shelves of generous size for a collection of treasured books
- Offers shelf heights of 37cm, 23cm and 25.5cm respectively
- Each shelf with a width of 107cm and depth of 23.5cm (42.25" and 9.25")
- Ormolu mounts frame the pair of cabinet doors in the manner of foliate rosettes
