This is an antique colonial campaign table. An Indian, solid rosewood dining table with leaf extension, dating to the Victorian empire, circa 1890.

- Delightful example of a campaign dining table – a truly rare and interesting piece
- Displays a desirable aged patina throughout
- Solid rosewood stocks present fine grain interest and rich caramel hues
- Figuring beams beneath a quality wax polish finish
- Circular when closed, the table offers a useful diameter of 122cm (48")
- Striking leaf extension of 59.5cm (23.5") adds useful length for dining
- Square apron with beaded edging meets four block shoulders with shaped brackets
 - Raised upon a quintet of tapering legs with arrow feet - screw in legs for ease of transportation on the front line

This is a charming and inviting antique colonial campaign table, graced with superb Rosewood stocks and pleasing colour. Solid joints and construction, delivered waxed, polished and ready for the dining room or institution.
