This is a large antique housekeeper's cabinet. An English, oak dresser or sideboard displaying Arts and Crafts taste in the manner of Liberty & D, dating to the Edwardian period, circa 1910.

- Impressive example of the Arts & Dry Crafts movement of the early 20th century
- Displays a desirable aged patina throughout
- Select oak shows fine grain interest and wisps of medullary rays
- Dark stained stocks beneath a quality wax polish finish
- Unmarked as such, crafted in the manner of Liberty & Do of London
- Back stand arranged as a glazed cupboard, arcaded display gallery and wide sideboard
  - Cabinet door with original plate glass with fascinating external strap hinges
  - Trio of support columns to either side with turned pilasters
- Single, wide drawer sits neatly above a generously sized recess ideal for a dog cushion
- $\bullet$  Cabinet to the opposite side with field panel doors, dressed with a small brass lock escutcheon key present
  - Gothic revival overtones present in the form of strap hinges and quarterfoil
