This is an antique canteen. An English, fine oak campaign cutlery case by Mappin & Webb, dating to the Edwardian period, circa 1910.

- Exceptional quality and of comprehensive arrangement
- Fine craftsmanship and form presents opportunity for use as a quality specimen cabinet
- Displaying a desirable aged patina and in very good order
- Select oak shows superior grain interest and wisps of medullary rays
- Rich caramel hues beam beneath the wax polish finish
- Gently rolled lid with unmarked shield cartouche - ideal for personalised engraving
- Pair of field panel doors, dressed with an inset brass-lined lock – in working order, key present
- Three drawer interior, each fitted with brass shield backplates with recessed handles
- Drawers lined with striking cobalt blue velvet, with small plaques for each type of cutlery
- Of large service size, hosting 108 absent pieces - drawers can hold 36, 43 and 29pcs respectively
- Brass drop handles to either side for ease of carriage in the campaign manner
