- The mirror lifts to reveal a suite of document slides, held securely by a sliding clasp
- Glass door lifts open to reveal a small selection of storage trays
- Decorated with small pierced brackets, the front tray lifts out for ease of access
- Dressed to the front fascia with an inset quaterfoil lock escutcheon key absent
