This is an antique rector's writing slope. An English, flame mahogany correspondence case, dating to the Georgian period, circa 1800.

- Select flame stocks present superb grain interest and rich russet hues
- Striking tooled and embossed saffron yellow leather in lightly aged order
- Quality case crafted for the dual purpose of writing and as a lectern for delivering sermons
 - Case dressed with an inset brass lock escutcheon in working order, key present
- \bullet Opening to reveal the writing skiver across two opening sections with storage to the trailing edge
 - Charming glass and brass ink well sits neatly within a compartment
- Key access to upper skiver hosting a removable stationery tray dressed with crimson crushed velvet covers
- Recessed brass support arm raises to three positions to support the outer reading rest

• Lid features a removable reading rest set within brass-line sockets
